The undersigned, **JULISSA GUZMAN BEATO**, Judicial Interpreter of the Court of First Instance of the National District, Dominican Republic, duly sworn in for the legal exercise of my functions, CERTIFY that I have translated the main and central parts of a document written originally in Spanish, the English version of which, to the best of my judgment, is as follows:

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE APPLICATION OF DECREE 225-07 DATED APRIL 19, 2007

To: The Regular and Non Regular Commercial Air Carriers (Charters) operating air services from and to Dominican Republic.

Appendix: Decree No. 225-07 dated April 19, 2007

According to the provisions of section 7 of Decree 225-07 enacted by the Executive Branch on April 19, 2007, as of July 1st of this current year, all the commercial air carriers operating international air services of fixed or regular itinerary and Charters or non regular, acting as withholding agents, must pay for the aeronautical and airport fees for passengers carried in the arrival and departure according to the following provisions:

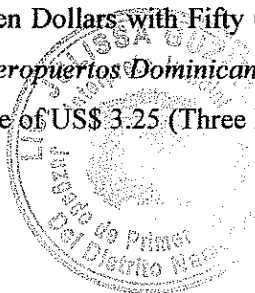
AERONAUTICAL FEES

Per arriving passenger US\$ 13.75 (Thirteen Dollars with Seventy Five cents of United States of America)

Per departing passenger US\$ 13.75 (Thirteen Dollars with Seventy Five cents of United States of America)

PAYMENT DISTRIBUTION FOR INTERNATIONAL AIRPORTS OF THE AMERICAS, PUERTO PLATA, SAMANA, EL HIGUERO, BARAHONA AND PUNTA CANA

Out of the aeronautical fee above mentioned of US\$ 13.75 per passengers carried arriving and departing, the airlines operating to and from the international airports of Las Américas, Puerto Plata, Samaná, El Higuero, Barahona and Punta Cana shall directly pay to the Dominican Institute of Civil Aviation (IDAC) US\$ 10.50 (Ten Dollars with Fifty Cents of United States of America), and shall pay, as the case may be, to *Aeropuertos Dominicanos Siglo 21 (AERODOM)* or to the Punta Cana Airport the remaining balance of US\$ 3.25 (Three Dollars with Twenty Five



cents of United States of America), per passenger carried both arriving and departing, respectively, to meet the provisions of Executive Branch specializing such payments: (a) to compensate the expenses corresponding to non governmental entities and services in the above airports (US\$ 1.00) (b) to purchase and finance the equipment and aeronautical systems as installed and to be installed in such air terminals (US\$ 1.00) (c) to transfer US\$ 0.50 to the Special Body of Airport Security (CESA), and (d) to transfer US\$ 0.75 to the Dominican Air Force (FAD).

PAYMENT DISTRIBUTION FOR INTERNATIONAL AIRPORTS OF EL CIBAO AND LA ROMANA

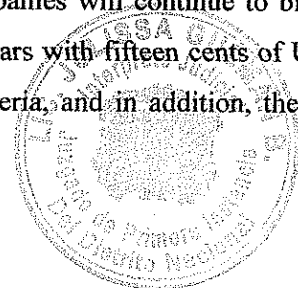
Of the aeronautical fee as above mentioned of US\$ 13.75 the airlines operating to and from the international airports of El Cibao and La Romana shall pay directly to the Instituto Dominicano de Aviación Civil - *Dominican Institute of Civil Aviation (IDAC)*, US\$ 11.50 (Eleven Dollars with Fifty Cents of United States of America) per passenger arriving and departing, and shall pay, as the case may be, to the El Cibao and La Romana airports the remaining balance of US\$ 2.25 (Two Dollars with Twenty Five cents of United States of America), per passenger carried both arriving and departing, respectively, to meet the provisions of the Executive Branch specializing such payments: (a) to compensate the expenses corresponding to the non governmental entities and services in the above airports (US\$ 1.00) (b) to transfer US\$ 0.50 to the Cuerpo Especializado de Seguridad Aeroportuaria - *Special Body of Airport Security (CESA)*, and (c) to transfer US\$ 0.75 to the Dominican Air Force (FAD).

AIRPORT FEES

Per arriving and departing passenger, US\$ 13.75 (Thirteen Dollars with Seventy Five cents of United States of America).

Per arriving and departing passenger, US\$ 13.75 (Thirteen Dollars with Seventy Five cents of United States of America).

The licensed and private airports and /or their sublicensed companies will continue to bill and collect the current uniform airport fee of US\$ 11.15 (Eleven dollars with fifteen cents of United States of America) according to their billing and collection criteria, and in addition, they will



directly bill the regular and non regular commercial air carriers the proper resulting readjustment of US\$ 2.60 (Two dollars with sixty cents of United States of America) for application of uniform fee of US\$ 13.75 based on the following breakdown, provided in Decree 225-07 dated April 19, 2007:

US\$ 1.85 for the licensed and private airports and/or their sublicensed companies.

US\$ 0.50 for the Special Body of Airport Security (CESA)

US\$ 0.25 for the Dominican Air Force (FAD)

CHARGES FOR ASSISTANCE SERVICES TO THE AIR NAVIGATION FOR APPROXIMATION AND TAKE-OFFS

As provided by section 5 of the Decree 225-07 the Dominican Institute of Civil Aviation (IDAC) was authorized to equal the fee that is currently being charged to the commercial airlines for the assistance services to air navigation for approximation and take-offs, at the same values currently being paid by the Charters or non regular airlines.

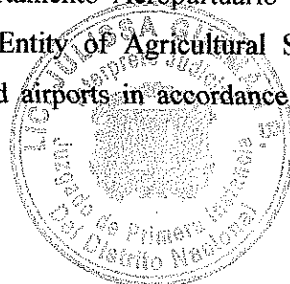
The Civil Aviation Board by virtue of the authority vested thereto by the mentioned Decree 225-07, in the next meeting will pass the Resolution indicated in the Sole Paragraph of Section 5 of the mentioned decree, in order to equal the fees charged to the regular airlines for the abovementioned services to the same levels and amounts of the fees currently being charged to the non regular airlines or Charters, this will become effective on June 1, 2007.

The Resolution of the Civil Aviation Board enacted to such effect will be duly notified to you.

ACLARATORY AND SUPPLEMENTARY PROVISIONS

FEE US\$ 1.30 (ONE DOLLAR THIRTY CENTS OF UNITED STATES OF AMERICA) OF THE AIRPORT DEPARTMENT

The provisions of Decree 225-07 dated April 19, 2007, do not include the fee currently charged directly to airlines by the licensed and private airports, of US\$ 1.30 per arriving and departing passenger, and destined by the private airports to the Departamento Aeropuertuario - *Airport Department* (US\$ 1.15) and to the International Regional Entity of Agricultural Sanitation (OIRSA) (US\$ 0.15) and which are withhold by the licensed airports in accordance with the provisions enacted by the Executive branch to such effect.



Such fee of US\$ 1.30 per arriving and departing passenger will continue to be paid by commercial airlines operating regular and non regular flights or Charters from and to Dominican Republic in hands of licensed and private airports, and on the other hand they will continue to destine it according to the regulations in force of the Executive branch and agreements with the Dominican State applicable thereto.

MANNER OF PAYMENT AND PENALTIES FOR PAYMENT DEFAULT.

As provided by Paragraph II of section 3 of Decree 225-07, and according to the provisions of Decree 442-06 dated October 3, 2006, all the commercial airlines shall pay the relevant amounts to the Dominican Institute of Civil Aviation (IDAC) by means of certified checks or wire bank transfers drafted on their behalf in US dollars.

As provided by the provisions contained in Paragraph I of Section 4 of Decree 225-07 and according to the provisions of Decree 442-06 of October 3, 2006, payments made in favor of the licensed and private airports and/or their sublicensed companies must be made through certified checks or wire bank transfers drafted on their behalf in US dollars and sent to the institutions and the bank accounts as appointed thereby.

As stated in section 6 of the mentioned Decree 225-07 the airlines subject to payment of fees and aeronautical and airport charges as appointed herein, are obliged to comply with payment of all economic obligations to be borne thereby by virtue of Decree 225-07 on behalf of the Dominican Institute of Civil Aviation (IDAC) and of the licensed and private and/or sublicensed companies, and the Civil Aviation Board may take the additional measures necessary to provide the penalties deemed pertinent to ensure the strict compliance and proper interpretation of the provisions of such Decree 225-07.
